
Keith's mum and dad are absolutely chuffed to be great-grandparents. To see them together with Liliana was certainly a highlight.

We need to talk...

Ominous words from a parent or serious-looking spouse, and though you aren't in trouble, there is something important we need to share.

Our trip to Victoria involved discussions around our future ministry and a return to PNG in 2022. The health issues Keith experienced during our final six months in PNG appeared to have sorted themselves out, and we have been given the okay to return pending our financial support being in order.



And here's the issue. While in PNG, the Board of Wycliffe Australia has expressed a concern that missionaries serving for extended periods are likely to find themselves financially disadvantaged upon retirement such that they are unable to provide for themselves in terms of housing, obtaining and maintaining a vehicle, health care, etc,.

It is the determination of the Board that existing minimum wage requirements in Australia should be applied to mission staff, and our financial support while serving in the field should also provide an appropriate amount to be saved for future needs. To that end, our ministry budget has been raised and we require an additional \$1,600 per month.

To be honest, this came as a bit of a shock to us, as we have always accepted that God has moved individuals and churches to support our ministry, and we have never gone without. Yet, we still feel that serving in Wycliffe is where the Lord wants us, and are choosing to respect those who take seriously their calling to care for us and guide us along that road.

Following discussions here, we have been approved to return to PNG from March 2022 for a 12-month assignment, aware that we will have already been a year away from our roles, on the understanding that we return to Australia in 2023 to focus on building our financial support base up to the required level.

We would appreciate two things from you, our supporters, in this current situation. Firstly, pray with us for God's leading as we seek additional support options, and that we trust Him to provide. Secondly, if you have any questions or comments regarding our financial support structures, please get in touch with us by email or phone. You are our partners in this ministry – through both prayer and finances – and we value your contribution.


- Pray for Elisabeth & Shawn as they work through relocating from Townsville to Perth. Shawn departs December, Elisabeth some time in February.
