We are jumping the gun on our September newsletter, but have good news to share... God has moved people to support us in amazing ways, and our return to PNG by the end of the month is locked in.



He who wills, and works...

We needed to return to Australia mid-2023 in order to obtain additional financial partnership after Wycliffe Australia restructured their ministry funding model in 2021. We had planned to reach out to several new church communities, also bringing a message of what God is doing in the lives of PNG people.

As we met with Townsville friends, then travelled south in late June – visiting the Townsville, Burdekin, Rockhampton, Yeppoon, Gin Gin, and Gladstone (with Mackay and Sarina to host us on the return journey next week) – our objectives were to thank current supporters for their faithfulness and to encourage them to continue praying for our situation to be resolved. Instead, many responded with assurances of supporting us even further, such that we returned from a trip to Perth seeing family, to find that we were only just short of the required amount.

Sharing with communities in Toowoomba, Caloundra, Kingaroy and Miles provided so much encouragement as we took the opportunity to speak of God's word impacting lives in PNG. We have been greatly blessed in this journey by so many dear brothers and sisters who prayed with us, generously supported us, opened their homes to us, fed us and even topped up our vehicle with fuel!

It reminded us that this ministry is a team effort, and that the process of building partnership in this way actually reinforces that God is in control.

Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do his will, working in us that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. And more equipping ...

Over the next three months, Elspeth will be in a mentoring role for two courses at the Ukarumpa Training Centre.

The Paratext 1 course in the first two weeks of September introduces PNG citizen translators to this globally utilised software program which enables translators to plan and organise, study and draft, check and revise Bible passages based on other comparable texts and the original Greek and Hebrew Scriptures, providing accurate, consistent and quality translated texts.



The *Initial Skills* course will run for five weeks during October and November, allowing participants to develop their English skills in order to effectively access extensive resources for the Bible translation task, and lay a foundation for other Bible translation courses.



Prayer points

- Praise God that Elspeth will make it back to Ukarumpa in time to participate in these two critical training courses.
- Pray for course participants who may be leaving families, gardens and other responsibilities in order to train for Bible translation. Pray for safety as they often travel days by boat and road transport.
