# Keith & Elspeth Campbell Equipping translation work in Papua New Guinea

Our first newsletter for 2025 is the final one as fully assigned here in Papua New Guinea. In a month's time we will return to Australia for a period of furlough ahead of Keith assuming a role with Wycliffe Bible Translators Australia (WBTA), though the people of PNG and the gospel ministry here will never be far from our hearts and minds.



#### Fare thee well...

Lord Byron wrote these words in 1816, at the time that his brief marriage ended in separation after a little more than a year.

Fare thee well! and if for ever, still for ever fare thee well! Even though unforgiving, never 'gainst thee shall my heart rebel.

We have seen many colleagues leave the ministry in PNG. Some, like ourselves, have responded to a call to take on another role elsewhere. Others have been, in some sense, forced to make the move due to health concerns or family responsibilities which require them back in their home country. A very small few leave with a sense of regret that events in PNG did not turn out for them as they would have hoped.

We had always expressed a desire to leave on God's terms rather than ours, though fully believing that **everything** actually happens on God's terms. What we meant by this is that we wanted it to be clear to ourselves and to others that any move was in response to God's leading, and not simply a preference on our part to be somewhere else.

Keith is leaving a role he has thoroughly enjoyed to take up a senior finance responsibility with WBTA. His focus will shift from solely PNG to include many other ministries in Australia and abroad. It is a major step, albeit one which Wycliffe had flagged as a potential role for Keith over a number of years now.

Elspeth will be maintaining her current role with the Academic Training Centre (ATC) in PNG. She will be providing remote support in developing course materials, and returning to Ukarumpa occasionally during training courses to be engaged in coordinating and teaching roles.

It is a great encouragement to us that everyone here is so understanding of our move. Yes, they are sad to see us go, but they also appreciate the need for an effectively staffed 'home front' providing support and equipping people to serve in mission fields around the world.

A Christmas project for Keith involved replacing our old minimalist porch with a more practical deck. Many tasks required a second pair of hands, so we recruited Tepi, our former casual yard worker, to be trades assistant. Keith always saw potential in Tepi to be more than an unskilled labourer, and this young man is now headed off to Port Moresby to obtain a Trade Certificate in electrical work. He certainly appreciated the opportunity to earn some funds towards his studies.

The new deck came in handy a few weeks later as the Aussies gathered for Australia Day, taking advantage of the event falling on a Sunday. We do miss our Public Holidays from home, as does an Indian friend who works with MAF, but lives within our mission community supporting the MAF children who attend our high school.

She joined the party.... though her

celebration focused on Republic Day in India, where they celebrate the adoption of the Indian Constitution on January 26, 1950.

### Blessed to bless...

While our Ukarumpa house lies vacant for a period of 8 months or so before Elspeth returns in January 2026 – we are making it available to one of Keith's co-workers.

Nathalie is a senior administrative Aviation employee with several key responsibilities, including HR, Training and Certification, and maintaining our internal procedural documentation. She hopes to study overseas and is waiting on the outcome of a scholarship application.

Nathalie is a local - hence ineligible for staff housing which is in limited supply - and lives with her mother and extended family in a village house



with rudimentary facilities, often having power outages, and having to make her way on foot through muddy paths to catch the bus to work each day.

We offered Nathalie our house as temporary accommodation for the remainder of the year, and she and her mum are overwhelmed by this blessing, and very thankful to God. It will be her first experience of living away from home as an adult.

You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.

If we start to feel road weary - we are collectively turning 120 this year – then our bed is wherever we can find a parking space.

On a side note, we are hoping that Lily will think that Pa and Nanna's vehicle is a pretty cool place to have sleepovers, and she may even join us for a few trips visiting churches.


